## Inspiration for our new building?

This is the "Cue" building at the Horniman Museum in Forest Hill. it is a system build (the <u>Walter Segal system</u>) and could provide a great model for our eventual new building.

So members of the Society are going to see the Cue Building on Tuesday 29th January, 11.00 - we rendezvous at the information desk in the main building. If you are free and interested do please come!

Travel to Forest Hill is probably best by public transport ... the museum is a short walk from Forest Hill "London Overground" service, and you can get there by catching a train from Shepherds Bush (NOT the underground Station, its just around the corner) to Clapham Junction, changing at Clapham Junction for Forest Hill. There's a train from Shepherds Bush at 9.33 that will get us there in nice time! Of course the Horniman is a great place to visit anyway - It's been on my to do list for ages!

This is not the only thing that we are considering; approaches have also been made to "Strawworks" who design and construct straw bale buildings, and we'll be visiting Ecobuild in March (the Excel Centre) to see what is on offer then. All being well we'll be able to make a decision on the building on the 19th March, and formally commission the design process. A deadline is that if we get planning application submitted before the 1st August, we can avoid paying the £600 odd planning fee!.

a few developments at the Reserve - the first is that we've finally finished the research on a new pond - Peter Edwards has been undertaking some detailed monitoring of water flow and quantity for the past year, and the decision is that we will enlarge an existing pond - it's up against the eastern boundary, on and quite close to the Visitors Centre; its where we always find frog spawn first, and it merits enlargement. We ll continue the programme and consider other works to the Ponds in the future.

And we ve agreed to put in some new fencing in the Paddock - the aim is to make the entrance to the Reserve more welcoming; this has been designed to be consistent with the new building project.


